within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, are holden and stand firmly bound and obliged unto *Samuel Holten* Esquire, Judge of the Probate of Wills, and for granting Administrations, within the County of *Essex* in the full sum of *two hundred dollars*

Esq? to be paid unto the said *Samuel Holten* his successors in the said office, or assigns: To the true payment whereof, we do bind ourselves and each of us, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, for the whole and in the whole, firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our seals—Dated the *fifth* day of *September* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *ten*.

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That if the above bounden *Martha Hartwell who is appointed Administratrix of all the Goods & Estate of Daniel Hartwell late of Topsfield aforesaid seaman deceased Intestate*

do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said *Martha Hartwell* or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *her*; and the same, so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the Registry of the Court of Probate for the said county of *Essex* at or before the *fifth* day of *December* next ensuing; and the same goods, chattels, rights and credits, and all other the goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased, at the time of *his* death, or which at any time after shall come into the hands and possession of the said *Martha*
